

## Personal Commission Guide

If you are reading this guide, firstly, thank you for taking an interest in my artwork! As you may have noticed in my previous artworks, I specialise in food-related and occassionally place-related illustrations. My passion is in capturing memories of food and places through my illustrations. At this stage, I am only taking commissions for for these two categories. This is because I am only comfortable in doing these at this moment and also because it is my interest that I would like to further develop. With this said, I am not limited to these two categories and happy to listen!

To get straight to it now, a personal commission is a piece of artwork that is customized for clients such as yourself and is for personal use only- for this reason, the digital file will not be sent unless requested for with substantial reason. Generally, your commissioned piece will be printed onto a 200gsm textured, archival (fine art) paper- this can also be customized if desired.

### How much does a piece of commissioned work cost?

A4 Size- Starting price from 2,800B

A3 Size- Starting price from 3,300B

Please let me know if you are interested in a custom size.

Full quotation will be provided after an agreement is made. Factors that change the pricing are the level of details, page coverage and the style of illustration. Currently I offer two different styles of illustrations.

#### What will be included in the final price?

Includes up to two revisions Delivery fees within Thailand

#### Please note:

Any major changes requested after the Initial stage into the Creation stage will automatically incur an additional fee of 1,000B. Examples of changes that are considered major are the change in illustration style, subject of interest and a drastic change in composition.

Further minor amendments desired after the 2 revisions included in the agreed upon final price will incur an additional fee of 300B each time



## Process

### Initial stage

This is the planning stage where I would like for you to express what kind of commissioned piece you are looking for. Some questions for you to consider:

What is the topic/subject of your desired illustration?

Which style of illustration would you like?

Do you have a preferred palette of colours?

Do you have reference photos that you would like me to transform into an illustration?

What size would you like your artwork to be printed on?

How much coverage would you like the illustration to take up on your preferred size of artwork?

This can take place from a questionnaire format, a call, an email- if you have other preferred methods, please let me know.

### Agreement Stage

I will send you a quotation of the final price based on the desires of your artwork.

### Securing Stage

If you are happy with the final price, I will ask you to secure your slot with a deposit of 50% of the final price agreed upon. For international payments, it will be up to you whether you would like to pay 50% or 100% of the final price (since there will be transaction fees).

#### Creation Stage

There will be a total of two revision opportunities. I will keep you updated with screenshots on a regular basis for progress. I think this will help both sides. Revisions are usually made in the composition stage and the colouring stage- but it is up to you!

## Approval Stage

A low resolution file will be sent to you for approval when the commissioned piece is completed.

#### Final Stage

Once you are happy with the artwork, I can get it printed and delivered to you!
